Statement by the Police Area Returning Officer

About Police and Crime Commissioners

On 2nd May, you will be able to vote for your Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC). The role of the PCC is to be the voice of the people and to hold the police to account.

Police and Crime Commissioners are elected to hold your police force to account for delivering the kind of policing you want to see. PCCs are responsible for the totality of policing in their force area and aim to cut crime and deliver an effective and efficient police service. PCCs bring a public voice to policing and they do this by:

- Engaging with the public and victims of crime to help set police and crime plans;
- Ensuring the police force budget is spent where it matters most; and
- Appointing the chief constable, holding them to account for delivery of their objectives, and if necessary, dismissing them.

The PCC does not "run" the police force. Chief constables continue to be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the police, but they are accountable to the public via the PCC.

In some Police Force Areas, PCCs are also responsible for Fire and Rescue Services, and are known as Police, Fire and Crime Commissioners (PFCCs). Furthermore, in some areas, neither a PCC nor PFCC is elected – instead there will be an election for a Mayor who will hold the PCC, PFCC or equivalent powers.

37 PCCs will be elected across England and Wales, of which 4 will be PFCCs – PFCCs are found in Cumbria, Essex, Staffordshire, and Northamptonshire.

Work with others

PCCs also work with your council and other organisations to promote and enable joined up working on community safety and criminal justice. As directly elected individuals, they provide opportunities for greater collaboration and effective scrutiny of public services. In doing so, PCCs also have regard to national cross border threats, and ensure there is an effective policing response.

Represent the entire community

PCCs are required to swear an oath of impartiality when they are elected to office. The oath is designed so that they can publicly set out their commitment to: serve all of the people in their Police Force Area; act with integrity and diligence; give a voice to the public; act with transparency so that they may be effectively held to account; and not interfere with the operational independence of police officers.

About your vote

You need to be registered to be able to vote.

If you are not registered visit **www.gov.uk/register-to-vote** or contact your local council.

If you are registered, and eligible to vote you can either vote in person at a polling station, by post, or by proxy (allowing someone you trust to vote on your behalf).

PCCs are elected using the first past the post voting system, where the candidate with the most votes, wins. Voters will vote by choosing a single candidate on the ballot paper. This is the same system as UK Parliamentary elections.

Election statement:

Edna Murphy brings a unique blend of expertise and insight to the role of Police and Crime Commissioner. She served as a Magistrate in Cambridge for over 25 years, including many years chairing the Youth Court, and she currently chairs the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Fire Authority, recognised as one of the most successful and respected in the country.

Edna believes the police need to do more on persistent problems such as sexual assault and on new priorities such as fraud. Most victims of those crimes do not report their experience to the police, with at best just one in six coming forward. This shows just how low victims' confidence is in our system of justice. That needs massively to improve.

Recent years have seen too many cuts in criminal justice expenditure. Edna is calling for better funding for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough police. Under the Tories, we have the seventh lowest funding per head of population in the country and the third lowest number of staff per 1,000 population. Cambridgeshire is low on the priority list for this Tory Government and residents deserve better.

As Police and Crime Commissioner, Edna will:

- 1) Fight not just for fair funding but also for smarter spending, moving away from policies that don't work to reduce crime, such as short prison sentences for non-violent offenders, and towards solutions that truly make us safer by making it less likely that any of us will be victims of crime in the future.
- 2) Champion effective crime reduction strategies such as restorative justice, tackling prolific offenders, and evidence-driven policing.
- 3) Above all, ensure that the police are proactive and treat victims with respect, not just as statistics.

Election statement:

I am passionate about our county and it has been an honour to serve as your Police and Crime Commissioner. When first elected three years ago I promised to cut crime – and I have done just that with:

- 1. Record number of police officers.
- 2. Neighbourhood crime down 24%.
- 3. Household burglary down 37%.
- 4. Anti-social behaviour down 30%.
- 5. Rural crime down 21%, hare coursing down 73%.
- 6. Knife crime down 26%.
- 7. Bike theft down 52%.
- 8. Roads are safer with serious injuries and fatalities down
- 9. £21.5 million additional funding secured from government to prevent crime and support victims locally.

I am an ex senior police officer having served 10 years in the Met and 20 years in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. I have dedicated my life to keeping you and your family safe.

The most important job of a PCC is to listen to the concerns of local communities and act upon them. I continue to do just that and developed a straightforward plan to reduce crime in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough:

- 1. Tackle crime and ASB further investment in local policing.
- 2. Communities first ensuring the police are visible.
- 3. Safer roads further investment to reduce speeding and prevent casualties.
- 4. Fighting drugs and violence further investment in prevention to reduce demand, dismantle County line drug gangs and their associated violence.
- 5. Tackling rural crime further investment in rural safety.
- 6. Preventing crime further investment in early intervention schemes.

I am a crime fighter and not a politician, with the vital experience required to be your PCC. So please support me in keeping all our communities safe.

As Police Area Returning Officer I am responsible for coordinating the election and announcing the result in Cambridgeshire.




